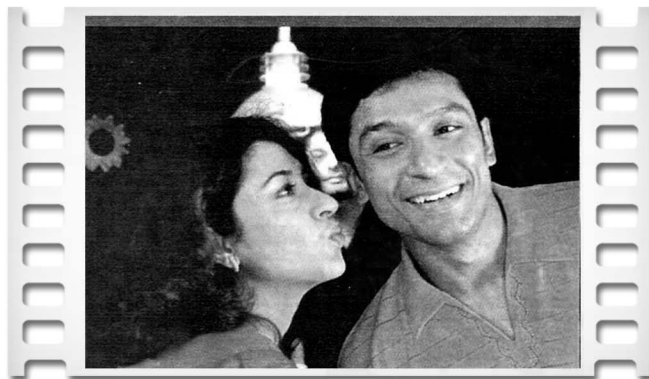

SYNOPSIS: In the Telangana region of Andhra Pradesh, South India, the Lambada community, a marginalized poverty-stricken nomadic tribe, nurtures a belief that a girl child is an ill omen, and needs to be got rid of at birth, while a male child is the harbinger of assured good life. This has led to the emergence of middlemen who spot the pregnant women in the community, scan them for the sex of fetus, and upon learning a girl baby is due, they cultivate mother by giving her a few rupees, some iron tablets, occasional meat et al, and take away the girl child on its birth, by paying paltry sums, for selling them to adoption agencies in western countries. Extreme penury drives these people to accept this offer, as it not only gives them a few morsels of food but they cajole the feeling that the girl may be safe in their hands. On the other hand in the cities like Hyderabad, women try to get rid of their female child on its birth by engaging hospital staff to swap the girl child for a male baby. The end result is that the girl child is becoming an unwanted creature in the poverty stricken households. Noticing that these Lambadas are the ones who build the "cyber towns" of the Hi-Tech cities that boast of IT industry, I felt their plight needs attention. Based on my documentary "Harvesting Baby Girls", this film is a fiction that has more facts than fiction.

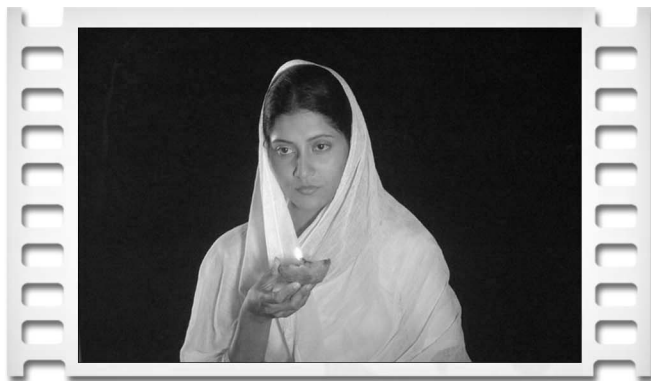

SYNOPSIS : Achchannai and his wife Nagalaxmi live with their widowed daughter-in-law Venkatalaxmi and grand daughter Rajalaxmi in a traditional society. Achchannai sets out to discover the truth when the news reaches him that in a distant town his son, who died eighteen years ago, has taken rebirth. He eventually brings the boy home which alters the lives of all concerned. The old Nagalaxmi for whom faith is essential, accepts him. The granddaughter, who swears by rationality, views it as a foul play, in fact even as a conspiracy. The widowed Venkatalaxmi, after an initial resistance, sees in the boy an opportunity to fulfil all her thwarted elemental desires and to escape the trauma of widowhood. All the tenets and canons of religious beliefs are used by Nagalaxmi to sustain her faith, while Rajalaxmi, her granddaughter takes recourse to the law and the court. Resisting all these Venkatalaxmi swears by her lived experience. Caught between the grandmother and granddaughter Venkatalaxmi's life becomes a rudderless boat. But herself evolves considerably when she balances her existential self and emotional being. It remains an essential question as to what constitutes the actual truth- whether it is the site of conflict that Rajalaxmi embraces or the mode of negotiations that Venkatalaxmi adopts. The film attempts to capture the inversions of social values held by three different generations.

The four-time Golden Lotus award winner Mr. Girish Kasaravalli needs no formal introduction to the students of serious cinema in the country and abroad. At the outset, Mr. Kasaravalli is known for his penchant to adopt published literary works for his celluloid aesthetics. As found in majority of his films, the creative essence of his films is generally marked with realistic narrative technique with a strong sense of history that naturally integrates itself with the theme brining in all minute and insightful details of humanity underlined by socio-political connotations without making room for any ideological pretensions.
